### **Travelling to Campus:**

#### **Bus**

- [Lothian Buses offers local bus services](#) 25, 34, 35, 45 and N25/N34 (night bus) to the Edinburgh Campus,
- Service 25 is the most frequent, leaving the city centre every 10 minutes during the day, and every 15 minutes after 8.00pm.
- The journey takes about 30–40 minutes from the city centre, depending on what time of day you're travelling.
- Fares from the city cost £2.00 single/£5.00 day ticket. Note that exact money is required for Lothian Buses if paying by cash. Lothian Buses also takes payment by debit/credit card for further information see <https://www.lothianbuses.com/contactless/>. International visitors should check their card to ensure compatibility.
- In addition, the First Bus 63 connects the campus to Edinburgh Park, The Gyle and Queensferry with a limited service: <https://www.mcgillsscotlandeast.co.uk/services/MESC/63>.

#### **Coach**

- All national coach services to Edinburgh arrive at St Andrew Square bus station, at the east end of Princes Street. Timetables can be found on the [Citylink website](#) and [National Express website](#).

#### **Car**

The Edinburgh Campus is easy to access by car from the centre of Edinburgh and from all major routes leading to the city. The University is half a mile from the Calder Junction of the A720 City of Edinburgh by-pass and the A71, and you'll see signs for Heriot-Watt University on your approach.

- Visitors to the University should use car park A, B, H or J.
- Disabled visitors can use the accessible car park at Gait 10 close to Main Reception.
- Parking is currently free of charge.
- Please note that all vehicles left on campus are at the owner's risk. Heriot Watt University does not accept liability for any damage or loss.

You can find the location of the car parks on the map of Edinburgh Campus. Additional accessible parking spaces are available throughout the campus; you can contact us for more information.

### Taxi

- Several taxi services, such as Central Taxis, are available at taxi ranks in the centre of Edinburgh, including Waverley and Haymarket rail stations and St Andrew Square bus station, as well as at Edinburgh airport.
- The journey to Heriot-Watt University takes about 20–30 minutes from the city centre, and about 10 minutes from Edinburgh airport.
- A return journey to the city centre costs approx. £30.00.

### Air

- [Edinburgh International Airport](#) is served by scheduled national and international flights.
- The airport is on the west side of the city, just three miles from the Edinburgh Campus.
- The Airlink bus takes you to the city centre (£4.50 single, £7.50 return), then you can take a Lothian Buses service 25, X25, 34, 45 or N25 (night bus) from the city centre to the campus (terminating at Riccarton).
- The bus journey from the airport takes about an hour.
- Alternatively, you can take an Edinburgh Trams service from the airport to Haymarket (£6.50 single, £9.00 return), then take a Lothian Buses service 25, X25 or N25 to the campus (terminating at Riccarton),
- The taxi journey from the airport to the campus takes about 10 minutes and costs approx. £25.00 return.

### Disabled Access

### Catering Facilities (Details subject to change)

- Monday to Friday a university operated catering outlet will be open for tea/coffee, snacks and lunch. Opening times can be checked on arrival to campus. Please note that on Saturday/Sunday's no university catering outlets are open.
- Oriam Sports Facility operate a small café which is open from 0830-1530 hrs, 7 days per week offering refreshments and light snacks. Opening times subject to change.
- The Student Union Shop is the on-campus convenience store, opening days/times can be checked on arrival.
- Courtyard Edinburgh West Hotel is open on campus offering 4-star accommodation, bar facilities and restaurant. Booking is recommended.

### Wi-Fi Access

- Free wi-fi is available within our conference facilities via The Cloud service, instructions on how to connect will be provided by your conference organiser.
- Free wi-fi is also available for guests staying in our Halls of Residence, instructions on how to connect will be provided at check-in.

### Other Campus Facilities

- A cash machine is located on the ground floor of the Hugh Nisbet Building.
- Laundrette facilities are available for those staying in our Halls of Residence. Additional charges apply.
- There is Medical Centre on campus open Mon-Fri only.
- We also have Oriam, Scotland's Sports Performance Centre on campus. Guests can use the facilities for a daily charge which is currently £10.00 per day.
